

WOOL HAND TUFTED RUGS



DETAILS:

Expertly crafted from 100% New Zealand wool, our hand-tufted rugs are renowned for their exceptional durability and timeless beauty. The tufting technique employs a specialized tufting gun to insert loops of yarn through a pre-woven backing, followed by precise trimming to achieve a soft, luxurious pile. This method offers unparalleled design freedom, allowing for intricate patterns and shapes that exceed the possibilities of traditional knotting.

Wool's natural resilience ensures the rug maintains its shape and vibrancy over time, while its inherent dirt-repellent qualities make it effortless to maintain.

With the ability to provide warmth and reduce ambient noise, these rugs seamlessly combine elegance with practicality, destined to enrich your space for generations.

FINISHES:

The hand-tufted rugs feature a smooth, resilient finish that ensures lasting luxury in your home. Each rug goes through a meticulous handmade carving finishing process to improve the sharpness of their patterns and produce a sophisticated, flawless effect. The clean, polished edges highlight the rug's craftsmanship, making it a timeless addition to any space.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS:

Shedding:

New wool rugs may shed naturally and this is caused by fibres in the yarn that are cut short and get detached from the pile. This will subside over time, depending on traffic, wear and the humidity of the environment. Regular vacuuming will help reduce shedding and it is essential to preserve the rug's beauty and longevity. We recommend using a canister vacuum on the lowest setting, avoiding beater bars for a gentler touch. Vacuum in the direction of the pile, ideally one to two times a week, to maintain the rug's plush texture. Refrain from vacuuming the edges or fringe; for delicate areas, a soft broom is ideal.

Creases and Odour:

For safer transportation, rugs are being rolled and packed in boxes. When in transit, creases may occur, but they should disappear within a week or two when the rug is laid out flat. Rolling the rug in a reversed way overnight might help.

Smells are caused by dyes, yarns and long-distance shipping under uncertain circumstances. Most odours will vanish within a week, once the rug is removed from its packaging.

Sprouts:

Loose fibres, or 'sprouts', are a normal part of the break-in process of handmade rugs. To remove sprouts from a cut- or loop-pile carpet, use a small pair of scissors to cut them off even with the other piles. It is recommended to not pull the piles out, as this can cause other piles to loosen too.

Cleaning:

In case of spills, blot gently with a clean, undyed cloth, being careful not to rub, as this can deepen the stain. For more stubborn marks, we advise professional cleaning.

To remove pet hair, a carpet brush, sweeper, or rake can be used with care.

Other recommendations:

Rotate your rug periodically to ensure even wear, particularly in high-traffic areas of your home.

Avoid direct sunlight, as prolonged exposure may cause the colours to fade over time.

Excessive humidity can be detrimental to your rug; avoid placing plants directly on it, and promptly blot any water spills to prevent absorption.

For added stability and to preserve your rug's appearance, we recommend using a rug pad.
